Mobile Pantry enables the Foodbank to take large quantities of emergency food to hard-to-reach and underserved communities. Our trucks transport the food and then community volunteers help unload and distribute the food to those in need.



Recognizing The Need

In Idaho, many parts of the state are rural and communities may not have a brick and mortar pantry for emergency food distribution. These communities may also have higher numbers of food insecurity among families, children and seniors. To help serve these people, The Idaho Foodbank takes truckloads of food to targeted communities once every month. This system enables people living in the hardest-to-reach areas of our state to receive the nutritious and wholesome food they need to relieve hunger and stay healthy.
