Mobile Pantry is an effective means for The Idaho Foodbank to get food directly to people in need. Foodbank trucks transport the food to a predetermined location and distribute it, often with the help of community volunteers.

Mobiles Meet the Need

Mobile pantries are a great way to address a wide variety of hunger-relief challenges.

Many rural communities in Idaho lack a brickand-mortar food pantry. This despite the fact that these areas often have a large number of food insecure families, children, and seniors. With the help of local volunteers, Mobile pantry can provide monthly food support.

Mobile pantries are also used to deliver food to targeted areas of need within urban centers. For example, a low-income apartment complex for seniors. Or, a neighborhood school where a high percentage of students qualify for free or reduced lunches.

Mobile pantries have also become a integral part of the Foodbank's hunger-to-health initiative. Through healthcare partnerships, food distributions are included in free public health screenings.

Mobile Pantry is delivering results for Idahoans in need.

The Idaho Foodbank is an independent, donor-supported, nonprofit organization founded in 1984, and is the largest distributor of free food assistance in Idaho. From warehouses in Boise, Lewiston and Pocatello, the Foodbank distributes around 1.5 million pounds of food each month through a network of more than 400 community partners. These include schools, food pantries, emergency shelters, feeding sites, and senior centers. The Foodbank also operates direct-service programs that promote healthy families and communities through good nutrition.
