From June to August, five days a week, children in low-income neighborhoods enjoy a nourishing lunch and educational or physical activity at a convenient location such as a community park or their housing complex.

Hunger Doesn't Take A Summer Vacation

The Idaho Foodbank is a sponsor of USDA's Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) that provides free summer meals to children ages 1-18. For children from families who are at or below the poverty level, the summer lunch program fills an important nutrition gap when school meals are not available. In addition to a nutritious meal, The Idaho Foodbank enlists volunteers from the community to provide enrichment activities and nutrition information to program participants. Volunteers range from single individuals to groups from various organizations. All volunteers are required to complete a background check.
